

School Visits

At St. Margaret's we believe that the learning outside the classroom enhances children's understanding of the world and is a crucial part of our curriculum.

We plan well organised trips such as: a walk around the local area, a trip to the library, a visit to the CLC, sports events, high school visits, as well as trips to museums, art galleries, theatres and zoos! The children gain a lot of knowledge, skills and understanding on such trips.

We will always contact you to inform you when a trip is going to take place but for local trips we only ask for an annual visit agreement (signed by you). It is of crucial importance that you have given school the most up-to-date contact details and medical information for your child and that you update this whenever there is a change to your circumstances.

Please read and agree to the legal requirement detailed below:

- i. I understand that the staff responsible for the activities will take all reasonable care of participants.**
- ii. I acknowledge the need for my child to behave responsibly.**
- iii. I consent to any emergency treatment necessary. I therefore authorise the party leader(s) to sign, on my behalf, any written form of consent required by the hospital authorities should medical treatment (a surgical operation or injection) be deemed necessary, provided that the delay required to obtain my signature might be considered, in the opinion of the doctor or surgeon concerned, likely to endanger my child's health or safety.**

If you wish to withhold your consent for your child to take part in any particular type or style of activity you should put this in writing and give the letter or note to the Headteacher, giving as much notice as possible of your wishes.


Fruit and Vegetables for our Reception Class, and Years 1 & 2

Most of our children enjoy a piece of fruit or vegetable as a snack at school.

We offer all of our children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 a chance to enjoy a free piece of fruit each day at school.

The range of fruit and vegetables over the year includes apples, bananas, satsuma's, pears as well as small carrots, cherry tomatoes and mini cucumbers. Sometimes strawberries are offered too.

If your child has an allergy for any particular fruit or vegetable and you would prefer him/her not to have that food, please complete the correct box on the back page and return to school as soon as possible.



Please note we will assume that there is no concern over food allergies if it is not commented upon on the back page and therefore offer your child the fruit available each day when available.

(N.B. Children will not be 'forced' to eat any fruit or vegetable if they do not wish to).

PUPIL COMPUTER USE AND INTERNET ACCESS

Each classroom and the ICT Suite at the school provide opportunities for the children to use a computer to support their studies, access the Internet and to use the electronic mail facilities.

Access to the computer systems is under the control of the staff of the school. **Apart from basic computer work to support classroom work, its use is only provided to those pupils whose parents have signed up their agreement to the school's need for regulations concerning computer use and have given their written permission for their child to use the school's systems.**

The internet and email facilities are provided for educational use only, and the school will not permit the accessing of inappropriate material via our ICT network, or the use of the email facility to send or receive inappropriate communications.

The school's system has built-in electronic safeguards, which will not permit access to the vast majority of 'adult' material. However, parents should be aware that it is still possible for a child to inadvertently access undesirable material. Children will be supervised. The system also logs all users' access to internet sites and email addresses, so it is very difficult for a pupil to access undesirable material without being detected.

In order to cut down on avoidable costs, pupils are not allowed to print out material from software programs, any internet site or email address, without getting prior approval from the adult supervising the activity.

Staff regularly supply the school website with photographs of our children taking part in meaningful and interesting learning activities, assemblies, trips and concerts. The children are not named. Occasionally the local paper also uses these pictures to report on school events.

We need your permission to share these images on the internet. Please sign the back page to ensure we know we have or do not have your consent.



If you have any queries or concerns over your child's use of the school computer system or the sharing of photographs, please discuss these with your child's class teacher.

- Complete homework and return it to school on time




PARENTS WILL SUPPORT SCHOOL BY:
